Purpose of The Accelerator

The Accelerator is a structured, self-facilitated scavenger hunt designed to improve communication, engagement, and collaboration through a guided problem-solving activity. It gives teams a shared moment of focus that resets how they interact day to day.

Organizations use it during:

- Quarterly meetings
- Retreats and offsites
- Department resets
- Culture-building initiatives
- Multi-location team alignment

This document outlines what the Accelerator includes, how it is delivered, and the expectations for facilitation.

What The Experience Is (And Is Not)

What it is:

- A professionally developed, narrative-driven team activity
- A guided sequence of clues and decisions that prompt collaboration
- A structured engagement tool that does not require outside facilitators
- A repeatable format that creates consistency across teams

What it is not:

- A trust fall or icebreaker session
- A loosely defined scavenger hunt
- A “fun add-on” with no measurable benefit
- A facilitator-dependent experience

This distinction matters for leadership teams evaluating ROI.

Objectives & Expected Outcomes

The Accelerator is designed to:

- Improve how teams communicate under time and task constraints
- Encourage equal participation across personalities and roles
- Reveal natural strengths and collaboration patterns
- Lower interpersonal friction
- Create a neutral shared experience that resets team dynamics

Organizations typically notice:

- More consistent participation
- Stronger cross-team communication
- Higher meeting engagement
- Improved morale following periods of stress or change

How The Experience Works
